13th Czech Rogaining Championships

June 27-28 2009, Nove Mesto in Ore Mountains on the Czech – German border. There were 300 participants, 86 teams in the 24-hour event, and 20 teams in the 6-hour.

A pleasant surprise for organizers was that our race attracted rogainers from ten European countries (Czech Republic, Germany, Slovakia, Poland, Bulgaria, Great Britain, Austria, Russia, Latvia and Italy). Many of them were newcomers trying a new sport, which was massively advertised by leaflets, local newspapers and on the race website. All were pretty satisfied and some of them promised they will become regular rogainers in future.

The tourist base map 1:50 000 was significantly upgraded. Organisers spent hundreds of hours in the terrain. The careful fieldwork resulted in a perfect event map which was printed on the Tyvek waterproof material. Electronic punching system SportIdent was used and a non-stop hash house was offered. Drinking water was all round the whole race area.

Although a dense grid of paths and tracks enabled quick running between checkpoints, there were many places that tested navigation skills of all competitors. It is not easy to keep direction when crossing streams in a bog or struggling through thick brakes of Carpathian pine. In addition organizers "ordered" foggy and rainy weather (together with a relatively pleasant temperature) so that even easy checkpoints became more interesting. The course was very demanding – there were steep slopes, marches and plenty of options where to go. Some teams reported that during the race they did not meet anyone for hours. Due to late snow season the water level was higher than usual. Although in the finish everybody was completely wet and tired, positive reactions and appreciation of marvellous landscape of the Ore Mountains prevailed.

Stepan Skripnik and Tomas Udrzal visited 56 from 63 checkpoints and repeated last year's victory. Results on the website:
