Observers for Ireland

We welcome Denis Deasy as the new IRF Observer for Ireland and thank Sean Hassett for his leadership in Irish rogaining over the last five years.

Competitive performance and age

Rob Taylor has provided some of the physiological information on which to base discussion of our age classes. The age at which performance starts to decrease significantly varies with the type of activity. In explosive, power-based activities it can be quite young. In ultra endurance activities it tends to be much later. There are internationally recognised factors applied to ultra endurance activities. For male competitors the age factors are:

| Up to 32 years old | 1.0000 |
|--------------------|--------|
| 40 years old | 0.9269 |
| 50 years old | 0.8315 |
| 55 years old | 0.7810 |
| 60 years old | 0.7283 |
| 65 years old | 0.6759 |
| 70 years old | 0.6236 |

The decrement:

- between open (32) and 40 is 0.9269 (0.9269/1.000).
- between 40 and 55 it is 0.8426.
- between 55 and 65 it is 0.8654.

Thus, the decrement from 40 to 55 is similar to the decrement between the shorter interval of 55 to 65 indicating that the decrease of performance accelerates with age.
